2025 Budgeting Process

In order for the Finance Committee to bring the Ministries Budget Request to Shiloh's Council, which will then present it along with the Missions Budget at the Annual Congregational Meeting on December 1, 2024, we first need input from each of the standing committees and Ministry Teams. If your Ministry Team needs budgeted funds next year, planning must begin now.

Committee and Ministry Team budget requests must be turned into the Business Manager by Wednesday, October 2.

The Finance Committee will present a summary of all budget requests to Council at their regular meeting on Sunday, October 20. On Monday, October 21, the Executive and Finance Committees will meet at 6:30 pm in the Large Conference Room with all committee chairs and any other interested parties to discuss budget requests.
